

COMMUNITY PLANS TO RECONNECT REDCLIFFE

Over the past five years The Redcliffe Neighbourhood Development Forum has been formulating a Neighbourhood Development Plan (The Plan) which sets out the community's vision for how Redcliffe should develop. The Plan aims to reunite North and South Redcliffe through a clear set of community priorities and policies such as:

Affordable Family Homes ■ 40% affordable homes ■ 50% of homes to be family sized.

Community infrastructure ■ Ground floor dedicated to uses that benefit the community including independent shops, crèches, health services, artist workshops etc ■ Smaller divided plots to encourage diversity and community-led housing.

A new network of safe and accessible spaces ■
An attractive and safe linear park along Redcliffe Hill
■ A fitting setting for St Mary Redcliffe Church ■
Refurbish the Quakers Burial Ground & Chatterton's
Gardens ■ Improve landscaping by including good design, street furniture, planting, water and lighting.

<u>Living Heritage</u> ■ Create a fitting setting for St Mary Redcliffe ■ Reduce the impact of traffic.

A better balance ■ Make the most of Redcliffe's city centre location next to the main train station ■ Reduction in the width of Redcliffe Way carriageway ■ Improve cycling and walking routes.


Support business & residents ■ Create facilities that make Redcliffe an attractive place to live and work including high-quality public and green space.

The new Metrobus bridge outside the Louisiana pub is progressing well. Having spoken to a few of the workmen I was informed that all the major support stuctures should be complete by the end of the January. The main span is then due to be lifted into place by the end of February which will enable the finished bridge to open to traffic before the end of March.

Prince Street bridge update

According to Councillor Mark Wright this is his news on the future of Prince Street bridge.

"An 'advisory' motion was brought before the Full Council in November regarding worries that it might be closed to cars when the repair works on it are finally completed. I have always opposed closing the bridge to cars because it is a critical access to Spike Island, which has only a couple of roads in and out, and I had already received assurances from the Cabinet councillor for Transport that it would remain open. I spoke for the Lib Dem group in favour of allowing cars to continue using the bridge, and in the end the Council voted 50 to 8 to do so, with just a few Green Party councillors voting against. We have been told that the repairs still won't be done until 'early in the new year'."
